



PENN VALLEY LITTLE LEAGUE

Policies and Procedures

This policy was approved by the Penn Valley Little League Board of Directors on 07/11/2018

Policy Amended on 03/06/19 and 3/16/20, 12/16/25

REGISTRATION

The league should open registration no later than November 15th for all divisions of play.

REFUNDS

Refunds of registration fees are available upon request in the event a player is no longer able to participate in PVLL, subject to the following guidelines.

Requests made prior to tryouts will be refunded 100%. Less the credit card fees.

Requests made after tryouts, but before uniforms have been purchased will be refunded at 50% of fees paid. Less the credit card fees.

There will be no refunds after uniforms have been ordered unless there are special circumstances (which will be discussed and voted on by the board)

Player Evaluations

Player evaluations shall be conducted on two Saturdays in the month of January.

All managers must be present to evaluate players for the draft of their division and division above.

Player evaluations are for divisions AA and above.

SCHEDULING OF GAMES

On opening day all teams should be scheduled to play if possible. Coordinating different dates for opening day with other leagues will aid in this. Opening Day schedules should be completed before the remainder of the schedule. This will avoid rescheduling after the fact.

Schedule the Minor games at 5pm instead of 7pm on weeknights. If a 7pm game is required, then

make sure Minor teams have no more than one 7pm game per week. Additionally, attempt to schedule an odd number of head-to-head league games to help facilitate TOC determination.

Avoid scheduling games during school spring breaks, open houses and on Memorial Day weekend.

AA to Juniors schedule will be determined at the Interleague level.

T-ball and Farm will be scheduled at the league level.

CURFEW

Minor Division: Games played Monday-Thursday shall end no later than 9:15pm.

Major Division: Games shall end no later than 9:45pm.

DOCUMENT CHECKS

Document checks will be conducted during player evaluations.

PRACTICES

The designated board member shall reserve the practice field at Williams Ranch and Ready Springs School in early February, let them know you would like to use the field starting in March.

The designated board member will assist in putting together a practice schedule for Managers. The Majors get first pick of practice times, then Minors, Farm and T-Ball. However, Majors should consider a later practice start time because of the children's ages.

VIOLATION OF PITCHING RULES

As a board, we understand that the rules are there for a reason. Specific to pitching and catching, these rules are based on research around what is safe for kids and their throwing arms at different stages of development. Ultimately, it is up to us as managers and as a league to keep kids safe. The following league policy is in place regarding pitching and catching rule violations:

"The first violation in a season of the pitching and catching rules as it relates to number of pitches, pitcher and/or catcher eligibility, or number of days rest for pitchers will result in the loss of one base coach for the rest of the game for the offending team. A second violation in the same season of any of the pitching/catching rules will result in an automatic one-game suspension of the manager the next scheduled game. The suspension is for the very next game following notification of the Board of a violation, and the Board's subsequent verification that a violation took place. This suspension is automatic and not dependent on whether the violation was intentional or not, nor is it dependent on a

protest being filed. Repeated violations, or violations that are deemed to be intentional, may result in further action by the Board."

Immediately upon being informed of a violation that is verified by the umpire, the offending manager must immediately make whatever player substitution(s) necessary to rectify the situation.

Additionally, managers must ensure that the official scorebook reflects any and all position changes for any pitchers and catchers. As such, any time that a team uses a new pitcher, or changes catchers, that change must be reflected in the scorebook. Substitutions not involving pitchers or catchers need not be reflected in the scorebook. Violations of this may also result in similar consequences as above."

TOURNAMENT OF CHAMPIONS

Juniors - 1st place team advances to TOC.

Majors - 1st and 2nd place advances to TOC. Team A and Team B best.

Minors: 1st place team advances to TOC.

DETERMINATION OF DIVISION CHAMPIONS

Major Division:

1. The Major Division Champion shall be based on the best overall season record. The team in each league with the best win-loss record shall be declared champion of the league.
 - a. If two teams in the Major division end with the same win-loss record, then the champion shall be determined by the better record in head-to-head games versus each other. If the head-to-head record is the same, then the team that scored the most runs in the head-to-head games shall be declared the champion. If a tie still exists then a one game playoff shall be played to determine the winner.

Minor Division:

1. The Minor division team with the best overall record within the Penn Valley Little League shall be declared the champion.
 - a. If two teams in the Minor division end with the same overall record then a one game playoff shall be played to determine the champion.

ALL STARS SELECTION

The PVLL Board of Directors will vote to determine the number of All Star teams that will represent the league in the tournament. Once this is determined the following procedure will be used to make player selections.

1. Each AAA Minor & Major division player gets 4 votes for All Stars. The top 4 vote-getters for each division are on their respective All-Star team.
2. The next 4 players are selected collectively by the managers of the division. The

remaining 4-5 players are selected solely by the All-Star manager.

Every effort should be made to pull eligible players from all teams in the division.

- a. The selected manager can collaborate with the other divisional managers about additional players that should be considered for the All-Star team. It's recommend that the All-Star manager **NOT** select the remaining 4-5 players for their team before the meeting is adjourned. The manager should take a couple of days to think, and without pressure from the other managers make their selections.
3. Divisional draft sequence is as follows; Based on league age as follows: 12U, 11U, 10U, 9U.
4. All Stars selection information should be kept confidential. Managers who are privy to roster information and do not take it seriously, thus disseminating roster information or selection discussions will be subject to disciplinary action. Board will give final approval before release of roster.

PVLL Board recommends that no more than 13 players should be on each All Starteam. The managers want to have as many kids as possible be recognized on All Stars, but with 14 kids on a team, there are two or more who play very little, if at all. With more than 13kids it's very difficult to win, and it will ensure a good number of disappointed parents.

ALL STARS Manager Section

Board approval must be a registered manager or coach for that season.

ALL STARS ANNOUNCEMENTS

Team announcements can be made as early as June 1st but not before.
